The BA Honours and Masters in French - Teaching French as a Foreign Language (TFFL), are aimed at present and future teachers, curriculum developers, present and future educational consultants and educational practitioners in the field of teaching French as a foreign language in Southern Africa. These degrees are offered in collaboration with the Alliance française du Cap, in partnership with the University Stendhal - Grenoble 3 (France) and the French National Centre for Distance Learning (Cned), with the support of the French Embassy in South Africa and of the Association of French Studies in Southern Africa.

Pre-requisites

A Bachelor degree with French as a major and an appropriate academic level in English and French or the equivalent, at the discretion of the Head of Department

Course Content

Semester 1: Research Methods / Landmarks in Modern Linguistic Thought / Initiation to Additional Language Proficiency / Teaching Methodology and Class Observation in French as a Foreign Language

Semester 2: Learning and Cognition / Teaching Methodology and Teaching Practice in French as a Foreign Language / Research Project

MASTERS IN FRENCH (TEACHING FRENCH AS A FOREIGN LANGUAGE)

By the end of the Coursework Masters, you will have a more in-depth knowledge of the French-speaking world and you will be able to:

Set up and monitor courses in French for Special Purposes / Set up and monitor courses in French using Information and Communication Technologies / Set up and monitor courses to train educators

Pre-requisites

BA Hons TFFL and a high academic level in English and French or the equivalent, at the discretion of the Head of Department

Course Content

Semester 1: The French-Speaking World / French for Special Purposes / Language Teaching and Technologies / Training Conception and management

Semester 2: Research Thesis

The MA in French (TFFL) is offered both as a face-to-face and distance-learning programme.

Candidates should indicate in their motivation letter which option they are applying for.

Please note that only candidates with good computer skills will be selected for the distance-learning option.

Letter of motivation / Detailed curriculum vitae (including e-mail address, telephone number and computer skills) / Certified photocopies of study record and academic transcript / 2 reference letters in support of the application / Letter of application for a scholarship, if needed.
