This year's festival, also known as World Music Day, is particularly special as it commemorates the 50th anniversary of UNESCO's International Music Day. Additionally, 2025 marks 30 years of IFAS in South Africa, reinforcing its long-standing commitment to fostering artistic and cultural exchange.

Call for Artists

IFAS invites musicians, bands, DJs, and poets to apply for the opportunity to perform at this dynamic free music festival. The festival offers a platform for emerging and established artists to showcase their talent, connect with audiences, and be part of an international celebration of music and creativity.

Selection Process

Due to the high volume of applications, no auditions will be held. A panel of industry professionals will review submissions and select artists based on originality, musical quality, and stage presence.

Requirements

- Must be available to perform live in Johannesburg on 21 June 2025.
- Must be able to deliver a 45-minute set with strong audience engagement.
- Must attend compulsory professional workshops in Johannesburg on 19 and 20 June 2025.

Performance Fees

• Music Bands: R5,500

• DJs: R3,000

• Poets: R1,000

About Fête de la Musique

Originally launched in France in 1982, Fête de la Musique has become a global celebration, now held in over 120 countries. Since arriving in Johannesburg 14 years ago, it has grown into one of the city's most anticipated cultural events, offering free performances across diverse genres.

Over the years, the festival has welcomed Msaki, BCUC, Samthing Soweto, Vaudou Game, Nakhane, and many more. It continues to serve as a launchpad for emerging talent, fostering artistic growth and cross-cultural collaboration.
